Rules for Possessives - English Grammar Rules & Usage

The possessive form is used with nouns referring to people, groups of people, countries, and animals. It shows a relationship of belonging between one thing and another. To form the possessive, add apostrophe + s to the noun. If the noun is plural, or already ends in s, just add an apostrophe after the s.

Avoid possessive pronouns (mine, yours, hers, ours, theirs) in such constructions. It should be mentioned that compound possessives are often clunky as well as confusing. For instance, a picture of her and Cesar's house could refer to a photo of "her" in front of the house that Cesar owns or a photo of the house that she and Cesar co-own.

Apostrophes | Punctuation Rules - Grammar and Punctuation

If we wanted to say that a baseball glove belonged to Gilbert, we would refer to the glove as Gilbert's baseball glove. You may ask yourself why we would ever need to write with the use of possessive nouns. The answer is that these word forms make the language of the sentence flow much better.

How to Create Possessives. You use possessives to indicate who owns what. If Squiggly owns a car, you say, "This is Squiggly's car." You use an apostrophe plus an "s" on the end of "Squiggly." You can also form a possessive by using the word "of," such as "The Crown Jewels of the United Kingdom." (Of course, you could also say, "the United Kingdom's Crown Jewels.")

Apostrophes and Possessive Pronouns. Personal pronouns, unlike regular nouns, do not use apostrophes to form possessives. Most writers don't have trouble with the possessive pronouns my, mine, his, her, and our. It's your, yours, hers, its, ours, their, and theirs, that tend to cause the confusion.
